Tulsa Engineering Foundation – Bridge Builder Scholarship Oklahoma Society of Professional Engineers – Tulsa Chapter American Public Works Association NE Branch

A scholarship for <u>college students</u> studying toward a career in engineering or related fields (Sophomore – Senior). Scholarships range from \$1000 to \$2,000.

Guidelines

Application Deadline: June 1, 2024

ELIGIBILITY – To be eligible, applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Applicant must be enrolled as an undergraduate student in an ABET accredited engineering or engineering technology program, or a field of study to prepare for a position in Public Works.
- 2. Applicant must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher.
- 3. Applicant must be able to accept the scholarship for the academic year starting in the Fall of 2024 and must not already be receiving full funding from other organizations.
- 4. To be considered for the American Public Works Association NE Branch scholarship, applicant need not be enrolled in engineering. They must include why they have the desire to work in the Public Works field.

Applicants should demonstrate high academic performance and show an enthusiastic interest in their professional development by participating in technical and/or other organizations, holding leadership positions, conducting research projects or pursuing related work experience.

APPLICATION – To be accepted for judging, an applicant must submit all of the following items:

- 1. **Application Form** The form must be fully completed and signed.
- 2. **Personal Essay** Essay written by applicant, not more than one typewritten page in length, and describing one or more of the following:
 - a. Why the applicant chose an engineering major or particular discipline.
 - b. What the applicant will accomplish or how they believe they will make a difference.
 - c. What or who influenced applicant to study engineering or a a field related to Public Works.
- **3. Supplemental Information/Resume** Provide as described on the application form.
- 4. **Transcript** Official copy of applicant's transcript(s) for the entire enrollment in current and prior college or university. An electronic copy of the official transcript is acceptable.
- 5. **Letter of Recommendation 1** from the applicant's department head, a professor, or faculty advisor.
- 6. **Letter of Recommendation 2** from another professor in whose class the applicant is, or has been, enrolled; or from an employer (engineering/technical related.)

MAILING INSTRUCTIONS: All application materials must be sent together as a single packet and mailed to the Tulsa Engineering Foundation, Att: B Wollmershauser, 6910 E 99th Pl, Tulsa, OK 74133-6229. The packet must be postmarked no later than June 1, 2024. Regular postage is fine.

DON'T focus on things you've done that may not have any relations to engineering.

DON'T jump around from topic to topic without structure.

DON"T make grammar mistakes.
